### Materials:

- White board, Board markers, Eraser
- Computer, Mp3(movie trailer(video))
- Worksheets (Vocabulary practice, Role play – 12 copies each)

### ➤ Main Aim:

- Students develop their reading skills through reading the plot summary of the recent movies
- Students gain useful information of the movies which can be seen now or in the future

### ➤ Secondary Aim:

- Students learn the various vocabularies written in the movie story.
- Students develop real-life communication skill by practicing selling movie tickets

### ➤ Personal Aim :

- Teacher encourages Ss to participate more actively by using real-life topic, so can gain teaching skill for Less TTT.

### Language Skills:

- Reading: Plot Summary of movies
- Listening: Movie trailer. Actors' dialogue
- Speaking: Practicing activities and Speaking in pairs
- Writing: Filling in the blank (Vocabulary matching)

### Language Systems:

- Grammar: Tense (past, present, future)
- Function: Persuading, Bidding
- Phonology: reunite / ignite / relive / relieve
- Lexis: Vocabularies
- Discourse: Giving information, opinions

### Assumptions:

- Students may be interested in the movie because it's familiar topic.
- Students may feel difficult in understanding some vocabularies
- Students may have movie preference.

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### Anticipated Errors and Solutions:

- Students may have difficulty in understanding full story because the plot summary presented is limited without conclusion
  - Encourage Ss to imagine the rest stories and make their own stories.
- Time may limit the participation of Ss
  - Volunteer group appointed.

#### **Plot summary**
