The Great Lakes are consisted of <u>Lake</u> Superior, Lake <u>Michigan</u> , <u>Lake</u> Huron, <u>Lake</u> Erie, and Lake <u>Ontario</u> . They form <u>the</u> largest group of freshwater lakes on Earth.
		What do you see in the form of these sentences? (Elicit SS tell of each use of 'the' or no-article.)
6 min		3. Conclude Great! You guys just learned nouns with zero article or definite article.
		(Erase those sentences and write 'Zero article' 'Definite article' on the board.)
		Are The Great Lakes consisted of group of lakes? Does Lake Michigan have group of lakes? What about Lake Seokchon in Ilsan, Korea?
		Like this case, we don't put any article for individual lakes, mountains, continents, most countries, states or cities. We don't need any article for Mars or Venus either. We put 'the' when it exists as groups or when we mention specific buildings or when we talk about geographical regions like 'the Middle East'.
