My experience about Learning English

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I think, English is global language so, many people learn English after their first language. A lot of people say English is a difficult language to learn, and I am inclined to agree because English grammar is very different from Korean grammar.

I started to learn English when I was in middle school. It was my second language learned. and I still remember my first English class when the teacher entered the room and he said to the class " We will have a test once a week and if you do not pass the test you will get a lot of Vocabulary homework, so you must study as hard as you can." since that day, I haven't really enjoyed studying English.

want to study English so you came here. It can be hard or It can be easy

depending on how much you enjoy it! So, when you speak English if it is the

wrong sentence, you don't have to worry about that. Have confidence and speak

as much as you can."

I have never seen a teacher say anything like that in Korea. Sometimes she is

like a teacher, sometimes sister and sometimes friend. She and I were close each

to other so when she has problems she came to me to talk about it also.

Through her, I learned a lot about Traditional Canadian culture so we became

friends.

If someone asks me how to learn English, I will tell them that story of the

Canadian teaching method, and also tell them not to be afraid of speaking to

native speaker. It will be hard at first but it will get better when you do that you

have taken an important first step which is showing a desire and drive to learn!

To conclude, I believe the teacher's ability to inspire the students to try and think

for themselves and figure things out, while at the same time offering support and

encouragement both in and sometimes out of class were what made the whole

thing an incredibly rewarding learning experience.

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
