	Reflect: • Conclude 1. meaning(explain) Explain to students the usage of frequency adverbs and have students look over different kinds of adverbs from always to almost always, usually, often, sometimes, rarely and to never.	We call them 'Adverbs of Frequency'. Anyone knows frequency? The frequency of an event is the number of times it happens during a particular period, how many times. We use adverbs of frequency to describe How Often we do something. Depending on the frequency, there are several adverbs of frequency. Take a look on the screen here to see different types of adverbs depending on frequency. From the most frequent to the least, If I <i>always</i> do something, as told you before, I did that before, and will do in the future. Let's see an example. 'I always watch TV in the evening.' It means I watched TV in the evening yesterday and I watch TV in this evening today, and I will watch TV at the same time tomorrow which means in the tomorrow evening. And 'Usually' is 90% of possibility of occurring. She <i>usually</i> eats rice for meals means she eats rice almost every meal. We can say 'frequently' as the similar meaning. As you can see, <i>frequently</i> means 80% of possibility but we don't calculate precisely when we say. And do not mind these numbers of percentage too much because it is just to help your understanding of the frequency level. Some has different view of it. What about 'often'? Often is used for slightly less frequent than usual. He <i>often</i> goes parents' house to visit them which means He visits his parents about 4 times per week. But if I say They <i>sometimes</i> wear suits to work. Then sometimes here indicates a half of week so that they dress up casually and formally half and half. What do I not usually eat in Korean food? I would say gobchang, and it is said 'I <i>barely/hardly/rarely or occasionally</i> eat Gobchang' which means I eat Gochang only once a month or once a year. If she cannot eat Sudae for its smell or special taste, we can say, 'she <i>never</i> eats Sudae' which mean zero possibility of doing so. <u>CCO</u> Tom, how often do you go to the lady's room? (A male student answers 'never' if he understands correctly) Maria, how often do you use chopsticks when you have a noodle? (A female student answers 'always' if sh
		bake cookies?

• Form Tell student where to put frequency adverbs in the sentence with examples.	Frequency adverbs normally go after the verb "to be" but before other verbs. For example, I am always happy on a Saturday night. / They are often late for class. / She sometimes smokes cigars. / We almost always go to France in May.
• drilling Have students listen to teacher's example as demonstration and supplies them a cue word to substitute in a slot. Students make a new sentence retaining the same pattern.	I want you to pay attention to what I will say and you need to change an adverb of frequency to another frequency adverb as listed on the screen. 'Diana often goes to the zoo'.
