|  |  | Form <br> Tell student where to put frequency adverbs in the sentence with examples. <br> - drilling <br> Have students listen to teacher's example as demonstration and supplies them a cue word to substitute in a slot. Students make a new sentence retaining the same pattern. | Frequency adverbs normally go after the verb "to be" but before other verbs.
